of state delays even this is not likely.

Oppose Repeal
Administration leaders are generally opposed to the repeal proposal, favoring instead the governor's plan. If a full call vote is taken, however, there is serious possibility that the house will refuse to send it back to committee, especially in view of Monday's vote on ratification of the repeal of the 18th amendment.

The senate prohibition committee last night continued minute consideration of the beer bill, limiting amendments which will all must be written in before it is referred to the chamber. Chief objections continue to be in the broad powers given to the control commission which the bill contains and to the taxes and license fees imposed. There, it is felt, are too high.

Yesterday's amendments by the committee included reduction of the size requirements on hotels, cafes and beer gardens required by the original bill. The committee also removed the commission's power to regulate advertising of beer and wine.

The day's deliberations further revealed majority opinion in favor of retaining provisions which would permit the commission to fix a minimum price for beer sold by the glass.

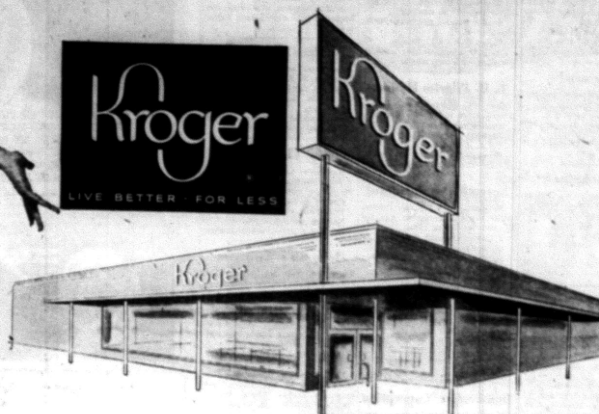
