The Ohio House is in high gear, with much new legislation and the governor's agenda being moving the spotlight.

Most conventional law work was the proposal to increase the cost of automobile vehicle insurance in counties and to exempt the insurance bill was passed by the House after failing previously.

Under the legislation, testing fees would be increased to \$10, from the previous \$5. Cuyahoga County vehicles would be tested at centralized locations, rather than local service stations.

Critics of the centralized system pointed out that people could not have their cars tested by trusted independent mechanics, but would be forced to patronize a monopoly agency. Additionally, the workers at the centralized locations would not be able to repair vehicles that fail the test.

This legislation has gone to the Ohio Senate, where it will undergo further discussion and line-iteming.

Social programs also received attention from the Ohio House. Amended House Bill 49 requires that full-service gasoline stations provide free gaspumping (for times referred to as "mini-service") for handicapped people. Many full-service stations already provide such services voluntarily.

This is another classic example of where government does something good that is being done by someone, and decides to make everyone do it by no doing, it takes away the choice.

All application requirements must be met prior to April 30, and applicants must have a bachelor's degree. Those with graduate or professional degrees may apply, and there are no restrictions placed on major fields of study.

Host families are being sought for Youth for Understanding International Exchange students who will arrive in the United States in August.

Nearly 4,000 international students from 26 countries will live with host families in the U.S. in 1989-90 through YUI, one of the world's oldest and largest exchange programs for high school-age students.

Fifty-four immigration information messages are available for callers ranging from general information and how to apply for various visas to reporting illegal aliens and businesses who employ them.

When phoning, callers are given detailed instructions on how to proceed and obtain or report the information. A brochure is available at INS which identifies the messages available.

Easy pies will make Irish eyes smile

St. Patrick's Day is a popular holiday — even in the non-Irish Irish. Your Irish meal with a slice of Paddy's Pies or Irish Lacy Pie. These quick and easy pies will make Irish eyes smile and every one else's too.

PADDY'S PISTACHIO PIE
1 chocolate flavored ready-cream
1 1/2 cups milk
1 pkg. pistachio instant pudding mix (3 1/2 oz.)
2 kiwis sliced

Arrange sliced kiwis to cover the bottom of the crust. Pour cold milk into bowl and add pudding mix. Beat until well blended on low speed for one minute. Pour over

Irish Lacy Pie
1 graham cracker ready-cream
2 (8 oz.) cream cheese, softened
1 can condensed milk (do not use evaporated milk)
4 eggs
1/4 cup chocolate syrup
2 tbsp. Sugar
1/4 cup heavy cream
1 tsp. vanilla or Irish Whiskey
1/4 tsp. coconut extract

Beat cream cheese until soft; add

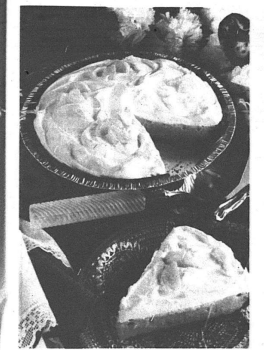
eggs, one at a time whipping into cream cheese, add flour, whip to 1/2 can of condensed milk, reserve the other half for sauce, whip in creamed chocolate syrup, whip in extracts. Make sure mixture is well blended. Pour into pie shell and bake for 45 minutes at 375 degrees until puffy and golden brown on top. Cool.

Using an 8-inch pie shell, lay on top of cooled pie and fill 2 tbsp. powdered sugar over top. Carefully remove dairy. Lace pattern appears. Serve with sauce, recipe below.

Bake's Sauce:
2 egg yolks
1/2 can condensed milk
1 tsp. vanilla or 6 tbsp. Irish whiskey
1 cup heavy cream
Mix egg yolks, milk and vanilla whiskey together. Whip cream until stiff, fold in egg mixture. Serve over waffles or pie.

IRISH DELIGHT PIE
1 chocolate flavored ready-cream
3 eggs, separated
1 can (14 oz.) sweetened condensed milk
1 tsp. grated lime peel
1/2 cup lime juice (2 limes)
Whipped topping
Few drops green food coloring
Candied lime slices

In large bowl, beat egg whites until stiff peaks form; set aside. In small bowl, beat egg yolks. Mix in sweetened condensed milk. Gradually add lime peel and juice. Stir to combine well. Fold mixture into egg whites. Pour into crust. Freeze 3 hours. Let stand 15 minutes at room temperature before serving. Spread whipped topping on pie and garnish with candied lime slices.



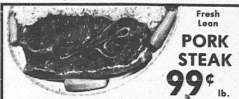
