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Sexual-abuse suit filed against ex-nun from order based in Adrian

BOSTON (UPI) — A Boston-area woman has filed a lawsuit against a former nun and teacher in Detroit, accusing her of sexually molesting her over a period of six years while she was a student at a Catholic high school there in the 1960s.

In the lawsuit, Mary Dantier-Rosenthal also charges that the archdiocese of Detroit, Dominican High School, and the Adrian Dominican Sisters, the religious order that ran the school, were negligent in allowing the alleged sexual molestation to occur.

Ms. Dantier-Rosenthal, who lives in a western suburb of Boston with her husband and two children and teaches writing at the Harvard Extension School, said she filed the lawsuit to "help bring the church to a new level of honesty and accountability."

"I am sure you can imagine how daunting it is for me to confront the church, even now," said Ms. Dantier-Rosenthal, 44, who grew up in a devout Catholic family in Detroit. But every time a victim alleges sexual abuse by nuns in that religious order.

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Computer users fret over plan to crack down on kiddie porn

CINCINNATI (AP) — FBI plans for national crackdown on people who stored or copied child pornography they arrested some computer users. Paddlewheel steamer pulled from sandbar

TROY, Ind. — A dredging crew yesterday freed the paddlewheel steamer American Queen from a sandbar on the Ohio River, where it had been stranded four days, officials said.

Tainted eggs blamed for Salmonella cases

EVANSVILLE, Ind. — State health officials said yesterday that tainted or rambled eggs probably were behind an outbreak of Salmonella earlier this month at a nursing home, making at least 35 people sick.

Three of the residents who tested positive for the infection died, but health workers said all of them had other serious illnesses prior to contracting Salmonella.

Epidemiologists with the Indiana State Department of Health said nonpasteurized soft-cooked scrambled eggs served at breakfast June 7 were the likely cause of the illness at the 199-bed Washington Manor Nursing Home. The state issued an emergency order Friday preventing the nursing home from admitting any new residents.

3 Dayton officers indicted in drug case
